### RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING HIGHLINE WATER DISTRICT TO ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE IN THE REGIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN OF KING COUNTY

**WHEREAS**, Highline Water District is vulnerable to the human and economic costs of natural, technological, and societal disasters; and

**WHEREAS**, the Highline Water District Board of Commissioners supports disaster mitigation efforts and regional disaster planning as a means of reducing or eliminating those vulnerabilities for the overall good and welfare of Highline Water District and the region; and

**WHEREAS**, additional agencies are expected to join the King County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan as annexes; and

WHEREAS, regular revisions and updates are required by FEMA; and

**WHEREAS**, a locally adopted plan reviewed and approved by FEMA is required under the Mitigation Act, 44 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 201,

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Board of Commissioners of Highline Water District, King County, Washington, as follows:

- 1. Highline Water District will actively participate in the Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan for future annexation to the King County Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan.
- 2. The Board authorizes the General Manager or designee to sign the required Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update Letter of Intent to Participate (Exhibit A, attached and incorporated herein by this reference) on behalf of Highline Water District.
