6.1 <u>CIP Project Updates</u>

- Project 17-1 Water System Improvements The contractor installed the main along 3rd Ave SW in Normandy Park and will begin installing services.
- Project 17-3 12th Pl S/13th Ave S Water Main Replacement The City of SeaTac (lead agency) awarded the construction contract to Kar-Vel Construction, Inc. A preconstruction meeting was held on 4/30/18. Construction will start in late-May.
- Project 18-1 S 223rd St Water Main Replacement The City of Des Moines (lead agency) awarded the construction contract to Scarsella Bros. Inc. A preconstruction meeting is scheduled for 5/7/18.
- Project 16-2 Pump Station No. 8 RH2 Engineers submitted 60% design drawings for review. The project will be advertised in October. Construction permits will be submitted to the City of Tukwila and City of SeaTac in May.
- Project 18-4 McMicken Well Repair A meeting is scheduled at RH2 this morning to discuss preliminary findings and recommendations to mitigate corrosion issues. The lead time to order a Byron Jackson pump and motor is between 26 and 32 weeks.
- Project 16-3 Mansion Hill Reservoir Relocation Stantec Consulting has completed 90% of the tank design. Plan submittals have been sent to the City of SeaTac. District staff, the District's legal counsel, and Sound Transit representatives will discuss a Federal Procurement issue with the Washington State Auditor.
