RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CONTRACT #18-70-14 WITH HOKKAIDO DRILLING, INC. FOR MCMICKEN WELL INSPECTION AND CLEANING

WHEREAS, at the April 3, 2018 Board meeting, the District's Engineer informed the Board that RH2 Engineering, Inc. recommended taking a hi-definition video of the well, cleaning the well and inspecting the well screens to determine if additional repairs would be necessary prior to installing a new pump and motor; and

WHEREAS, on May 10, 2018, the District sent a request for proposals to contractors from the District's MRSC Roster for the well inspection and cleaning. The District received two responsive bids; and

WHEREAS, the District reviewed the bids and references and recommends awarding the construction contract to Hokkaido Drilling, Inc., the lowest responsive and responsible bidder (Attachment 2, incorporated herein by this reference).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Highline Water District, King County, Washington, as follows:

- The General Manager or designee is authorized to enter into Contract #18-70-14 (Attachment 1, incorporated herein by this reference) with Hokkaido Drilling, Inc. for a not-to-exceed amount of \$35,500.00 plus sales tax.
- The General Manager and/or the District's legal counsel are authorized to make minor changes to the contract if required.

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is entered into between **HIGHLINE WATER DISTRICT**, King County, Washington, a municipal corporation and special purpose district organized and existing under the laws of the State of Washington (hereafter referred to as "the District"), and **HOKKAIDO DRILLING, INC.** (hereafter referred to as "the Contractor"), in consideration of the mutual benefits, terms and conditions hereinafter specified.

- 1. <u>Project.</u> The Contractor shall do all work and furnish all tools, materials and equipment for the District's project known as: *McMicken Well Inspection and Cleaning*
 - ("Project") in accordance with and as described in the Scope of Work and Contractor's proposal attached as **Appendix A and B**, and incorporated herein by this reference.
- 2. <u>District Agreement.</u> The District employs the Contractor to provide the materials and to do and cause to be done the Project work described above and to complete and finish the work according to the attached plans and specifications, if any, and the terms and conditions of this contract and agrees to pay for the work at the time, in the manner and upon the conditions provided for in this contract.
- 3. <u>Contractor Agreement.</u> The Contractor agrees to fully perform the work upon all terms and conditions as contained in this contract. The Contractor shall provide and bear the expense of all equipment, work, and labor of any sort whatsoever that may be required for the transfer of materials and for constructing and completing the project provided for in this contract, except those that are mentioned in the specifications to be furnished by the District.
- 4. <u>Completion Deadline/Liquidated Damages.</u> The work must commence within fifteen (15) calendar days of the provision of the agreed Notice to Proceed. Completion time shall be within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt by the Contractor of the notice to proceed issued by the Owner. There shall be no work performed on holidays or weekends, unless approval for such work is granted by District. Requests for such extended work shall be made at least 24 hours prior to that requested time. Coordination with Highline Water District for access to the site is required. Contact Jeremy DelMar, Engineering and Operations Manager, at (206) 592-8904.

If the work is not completed within that time period, because of difficulty in computing the actual damages to the District arising from any delay in completing this Agreement, it is determined in advance and agreed by the parties that the Contractor shall pay the District the amount of \$100.00 per calendar day that the work remains uncompleted after expiration of the specified time for completion. The parties agree that this amount represents a reasonable forecast of the actual damages which the District will suffer by failure of the Contractor to complete the work within the agreed time period. The execution of this Agreement shall constitute acknowledgment by the Contractor that the Contractor has ascertained and agrees that the District will actually suffer damages in the above amount for each day during which the completion of the work is avoidably delayed beyond the agreed completion date.

5. <u>Project Cost.</u> The project cost shall be on a time and materials basis not to exceed \$35,500.00 plus 10% Washington State sales tax unless amended and authorized by the District.

Payment Terms. The District shall pay the Contractor on the following terms: Incremental payments, plus Washington State Sales tax to be paid from a contractor invoice (which must be approved by the District's Engineering/Operations Manager or designated Supervisor). Per RCW 60.28.11(1)(a) public improvement contracts must provide, and public bodies must reserve, a contract retainage not to exceed five percent of the moneys earned by the contractor as a trust fund for the protection and payment of: (i) The claims of any person arising under the contract; and (ii) the state with respect to taxes, increases, and penalties imposed pursuant to Titles 50, 51, and 82 RCW which may be due from such contractor.

7. Prevailing Wages (Appendix C).

The Contractor shall pay prevailing wages and shall comply with RCW 39.12 and RCW 49.28. A Notice of Intent to Pay Prevailing Wages and prevailing wage rates for the work must be posted for the benefit of workers. At the conclusion of the Agreement, the Contractor and its subcontractors shall submit Affidavits of Wages Paid to the Department of Labor and Industries for certification by the director. Final payment on the Agreement shall be withheld until certification by the director has been received by the District that the prevailing wage requirements of the law have been satisfied. The Contractor hereby certifies that it has not been cited for two violations within the last five (5) years, and is thus prohibited from bidding on public works projects. The Contractor further assures the District that it will use no subcontractor who is thus prohibited.

8. Indemnification and Hold Harmless. The Contractor shall indemnify, defend and save the District and its commissioners, manager, employees and engineers harmless from any and all claims and risks and losses, damages, demands, suits, judgments and attorney's fees or other expenses of any kind on account of or relating to injury to or death of any and all persons or on account of all property damage of any kind, or in any manner connected with the work performed under this Agreement, or caused in whole or in part by reason of the presence of the Contractor, a subcontractor or their property, employees or agents during performance of the work or at any time before final acceptance, except only for those losses resulting from and to the extent of the sole negligence of the District with regard to activities within the Contractor's scope of work.

Should a court of competent jurisdiction determine that this Agreement is subject to RCW 4.24.115, then, in the event of liability for damages arising out of bodily injury to persons or damages to property caused by or resulting from the concurrent negligence of the Contractor and the District, its members, officers, employees and agents, the Contractor's liability hereunder shall be only to the extent of the Contractor's negligence.

In a lawsuit with respect to this hold harmless provision, the Contractor shall prepare and defend that lawsuit at its own cost and expense. If judgment is rendered or settlement made requiring payment of damages by the District, its officers, agents, employees and volunteers, the Contractor shall pay the same.

9. <u>Bond.</u>

RCW 39.08.010 (effective 7/23/17)

(3) On contracts of one hundred fifty thousand dollars or less, at the option of the contractor or the general contractor/construction manager as defined in RCW 39.10.210, the respective public entity may, in lieu of the bond, **retain ten percent** of the contract amount for a period

of thirty days after date of final acceptance, or until receipt of all necessary releases from the department of revenue, the employment security department, and the department of labor and industries and settlement of any liens filed under chapter 60.28 RCW, whichever is later. The recovery of unpaid wages and benefits must be the first priority for any actions filed against retainage held by a state agency or authorized local government.

- (4) For contracts of one hundred fifty thousand dollars or less, the public entity may accept a full payment and performance bond from an individual surety or sureties (**Appendix D**).
- (5) The surety must agree to be bound by the laws of the state of Washington and subjected to the jurisdiction of the state of Washington.

10. Insurance.

- 10a The Contractor shall obtain and keep in force during the term of this Agreement Commercial General Liability and Automobile Liability insurance policies with insurance companies which have an A.M. Best's rating of A VII or better, and which are approved by the Washington Insurance Commissioner pursuant to RCW 48.
- The Contractor shall file with the District a certified copy of all policies or a certificate of insurance evidencing that the policies are in force. The certificate shall be accompanied by policy endorsements as are necessary to comply with these requirements. The Contractor's Department of Labor & Industries' account number shall be noted on the certificate of insurance. Failure of the Contractor to fully comply with the requirements regarding insurance will be considered a material breach of contract and shall be cause for immediate termination of the contract.
- 10c In addition, the Contractor shall have its insurance agent/representative complete the District's Insurance Coverage Questionnaire (**Appendix E**) and attach it to the certificate of insurance for the District's approval.
- 10d The Contractor shall not begin work under the Agreement until all required insurance has been obtained and until such insurances have been received by the District. The insurance shall provide coverage for the Contractor, his subcontractors and the District.
- The insurance policies shall specifically name the District, its elected or appointed officials, officers, employees and volunteers as insureds with regard to damages and defense of claims arising from: (I) activities performed by or on behalf of the Contractor; or (ii) products and completed operations of the Contractor; or (iii) premises owned, leased or used by the Contractor. The insurance shall be maintained in full force and effect at the Contractor's expense throughout the term of the Agreement.
- 10f The coverage provided by the Contractor's insurance policies shall be primary to any insurance maintained by the District, except as respects losses attributable to the sole negligence of the District. Any insurance that might cover this Agreement which is maintained by the District shall be in excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with the Contractor's insurance.

- **10g** The General Aggregate provision of the Contractor's insurance policies shall be amended to show that the General Aggregate Limit of the policies applies separately to this contract.
- 10h Types and Limits of Insurance Requires:

COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY

- \$1,000,000 per occurrence liability (including extended bodily injury)
- \$2,000,000 annual aggregate
- District Employees, Elected and Appointed Officials and Volunteers as Additional Insureds
- Workmen's Compensation L1 employees of Contractor and Subcontractors are to be insured under Washington State Industrial Insurance. Contractor shall also be required to carry Stop Gap Liability Insurance for \$500,000 each occurrence, each accident.
- Employers Liability (Stop-gap)

AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY

- ▶ \$1,000,000 per accident bodily injury and property damage liability, including:
- Any owned, hired or non-owner automobile.
- 10i The Contractor shall be solely and completely responsible for safety and safety conditions on the job site, including the safety of all persons and property during performance of the work. The Contractor shall provide safe access for the District and its inspectors to adequately inspect the quality of work and the conformance with project specifications.
- 11. <u>Termination</u>. The District may terminate this Agreement at any time upon written notice to Contractor, subject to the District's obligation to pay Contractor in accordance with subsections A and B below.
 - In the event this Agreement is terminated by the District other than for fault on the part of the Contractor, a final payment shall be made to the Contractor for actual cost of work completed at the time of termination of the Agreement. No payment shall be made for any work completed after receipt by the Contractor of the termination notice. If the accumulated payment(s) made to the Contractor prior to the termination notice exceeds the total amount that would be due as set forth in this subsection, then no final payment shall be due and the Contractor shall immediately reimburse the District for any excess paid.

In the event the services of the Contractor are terminated by the District for fault on the part of the Contractor, subsection A of this section shall not apply. In such event the amount to be paid shall be determined by the District with consideration given to the actual costs incurred by the Contractor in performing the work to the date of termination, the amount of work originally required which was satisfactorily completed to date of termination, whether that work is in a form or of a type which is usable by the District at the time of termination, the cost to the District of employing another person or firm to complete the work required and the time which may be required to do so, and other factors which affect the value to the District of the work performed at the time of termination. Under no circumstances shall payment made under this subsection exceed the amount which would have been made if subsection A of this section applied.

12. <u>Dispute Resolution.</u>

HIGHLINE WATER DISTRICT

- Mediation. If any dispute, controversy, or claim arises out of or relates to this Agreement, the parties agree first to try to settle the dispute by non-binding mediation with the assistance of a recognized professional mediation service. The parties shall each designate a representative with full settlement authority who will participate for at least four hours in the mediation. The parties shall bear equally all expenses, exclusive of attorneys' fees associated with the mediation.
- **13.** Effective Date. The effective date of this Agreement shall be the date that the Agreement is signed by an authorized representative of the District.
- **14.** Authority. The individuals who sign this Agreement on behalf of the respective party represent and warrant they have the full power and authority and are authorized by the party to do so.

1. General

Highline Water District, herein referred to as the District, requires the inspection and cleaning of a water well located on the McMicken Well and Treatment Plant site located at 3763 S 164th St in SeaTac, WA within Section 27, Township 23 North, Range 4 East in King County, Washington (see vicinity map – **Attachment A**).

The District began operation of the McMicken Well and Treatment Plant in 2012. In 2017, the District experienced a gradual decline in well production. The District retained the pump supplier to remove the pump and motor to visually inspect the equipment. During removal, the pipe column separated causing the pump to drop into the well. The pump was subsequently removed and determined to be damaged beyond repair.

This contract will retain a firm to remove the remaining debris within the well, initially video inspect the interior casings for damage, mechanically scrub the well and well screens, bail any debris from the sump, and perform a final video inspection upon completion of the cleaning. The severity of damage to the well, casings and well screen from the pump are unknown; this contract may include repairs as a change order.

The Contractor shall be responsible for site preparation, as well as loading, hauling, and legal off-site disposal of all solid development spoils. The Contractor will be required to provide all necessary labor, materials, and equipment, including, but not limited to: containment for all development spoils removed from the well; and all pumping equipment and discharge lines required to escort water to the sanitary sewer for disposal. The Contractor shall also provide all necessary and appropriate personal safety equipment for the work crew and a means to safely and accurately monitor the water during disposal. It is the Contractor's responsibility to protect the exposed wellhead, stockpiled development spoils, and the Contractor's equipment throughout the course of the project. The Contractor will be responsible for securing all permits and approvals, including but not limited to preparation of a sewer discharge plan for review to secure permission to discharge from Department of Ecology and Valley View Sewer District, if required.

2. Scope of Work

The intent of this project is to inspect and clean the McMicken Well; A well log detailing the completion design for the well is included with these specifications (see **Attachment B**).

The Contractor shall conduct traditional development of the well using a cable tool drilling rig and tight fitting wire brushes to clean the well casing and screens and remove native material and debris with a sand pump bailer. The Contractor will provide the District with detailed notes of sand volume produced during cleaning to help identify potential breaches in the pack material. Water and development spoils shall be contained above ground to minimize contact with the soil as these materials may contain viable bacteria that the District does not want to reenter the well environment. Sand, scale, debris and organic material removed from the wells, estimated at five cubic yards or less may be stockpiled temporarily on site so long as it is not in contact with the ground, but loading, hauling, and legal, off-site disposal of this material is the Contractor's responsibility.

All development activities shall be performed in accordance with applicable requirements of Washington Administrative Code 173-160 (WAC), and the requirements of these specifications. Where the requirements of these specifications are more stringent, the requirements of the

specifications shall prevail, provided that nothing in these specifications shall be construed to require work in violation of the WAC.

3. Equipment and Materials

- 3.1 <u>Drilling Machine</u>. Development activities shall be accomplished with a cable-tool rig of no less capability than a 71-SpeedStar. All appurtenant equipment including, but not limited to, bailers, wire brushes, and surge tools are to be considered as part of the rig, available to the project as needed, and delivered to the site as a function of job mobilization.
- 3.2 <u>Extra Materials and Equipment</u> Video equipment shall be high resolution of sufficient clarity to document the condition of the well casings.

4. Execution of Work

- 4.1 <u>Completion Time shall be as noted in the Agreement.</u>
- 4.2 Records. The Contractor shall keep a daily written log of all site activities, including: tools used; depth to water at the beginning and end of the shift; and progress of work, including relative volumes of debris produced. A duplicate copy of the daily log shall be furnished to and approved by the District no later than the beginning of the following day's work.
- 4.3 <u>Scheduling and Communication</u>. The Contractor will provide the District in advance with a schedule for site work, including anticipated daily arrival and departure times and any foreseeable schedule conflicts. The Contractor is responsible for notifying the District, preferably in advance, of any conditions resulting in a delayed arrival to or early departure from site or if the Contractor will not be on site during a scheduled work day. To facilitate communication with the District, the Contractor and crew will have a working cellular phone or other means of communication on-site at all times.
- 4.4 <u>Welding</u>. All arc welding shall be accomplished using standard procedures (American Welding Society, 1981). The Contractor assumes full responsibility for any breakage of welds, or weld failure during the course of the work.
- 4.6 <u>Capping</u>. At all times during the progress of the work, the Contractor shall protect the well in such a manner as to effectively prevent either tampering with the well or entrance of foreign matter into it.
- 4.7 <u>Disposal of Development Spoils</u> will be off-site. The Contractor must make provisions to contain development water and spoils in such a manner so as to not contact the surface soils of the site. Solid spoils (sand, scale, debris and organic material) are the Contractor's responsibility. These materials may be temporarily stockpiled on site (off of the ground), but all transportation and disposal costs are to be included in the Contractor's lump-sum Mobilization and Demobilization cost. The Contractor will take appropriate steps throughout the project to prevent water and material from entering local streams or water bodies as a result of site activities.
- 4.8 <u>Federal, State and Local Taxes, Licenses, and Permits.</u> Contractor is solely responsible for complying with all laws, ordinances and regulations on taxes, licenses and permits, as they may apply to any matter under this Agreement. Contractor shall, at no expense to the

District, procure and keep in force during the entire period of the contract all such permits and licenses.

4.9 <u>Environmental Safety Requirements.</u> The Contractor shall comply with all applicable Federal, State and Local environmental, occupational, and safety statutes, regulations and guidelines.

There shall be no disposal of hazardous materials on District property or down sanitary or storm sewer drains, and shall be no disposal of any materials, including water or wastewater, down storm drains.

All hazardous wastes generated by the Contractor are the responsibility of the Contractor for lawful disposal. Contractor shall dispose of them in an environmentally responsible manner and in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.

5. Submittals

<u>Project Invoices</u>. The Contractor will provide the District with a copy of each invoice. The District will review the invoice for accuracy. The Contractor will allow sufficient time for this review such that the District's schedule submittal of invoices can still be met.

6. Insurance and Indemnity

Insurance and Indemnity coverages are as described in Sections 11 and 12 of the Agreement.

7. Measurement and Payment

- 7.1 <u>Mobilization and Demobilization</u> shall be paid at the rate of 70% of price bid when work starts and the final 30% when all equipment are removed from the site and the site is left in a clean and orderly state. This item includes all work, labor, equipment and materials and incidentals to mobilize and demobilize, including but not limited to: safety equipment; stockpiling, loading, hauling, and legal off-site disposal of development spoils; site preparation, and the fee for the Washington Department of Ecology Notice of Intent.
- 7.2 <u>Video Inspection</u> shall be paid for 50% upon initial video and 50% upon final video. It is assumed two video inspections are required: the first after removal of debris to evaluate the condition of the well and the second upon final cleaning and any repair work.
- Authorized Rig Work shall be paid for any directed work that requires a fully operating rig and a minimum of a two-person crew and is not otherwise covered by unit prices herein. No extra payment for hourly work shall be made when equipment being used is not in good working condition. Hourly work includes gaining and restoring access to the well; cleaning well casing and screens; removal of debris from sump and other work as authorized by the District.
- 7.4 <u>Minor Change</u> The unit price of Minor Change shall be per Force Account (FA) in accordance with Section 1-04.4(1) of the Standard Specifications, and has been included for any additional work associated with minor changes. An estimated dollar amount for Minor Change Item has been entered in the Bid Proposal by the District, to provide a common proposal for all Bidders which have been figured into the Contract Sum.

Payments or credits for changes amounting to \$10,000 or less may be made under the bid

item "Minor Changes", at the discretion of the Owner, and in accordance with Section 1-04.4(1) of the Standard Specifications. The actual amount paid under this item may vary from no payment to the full amount of the bid item. At the time of authorization, the District and Contractor will agree to the basis of compensation for that work, by one of the following methods:

- 1. By an accepted lump sum proposal from the Contractor;
- 2. By Bid prices already established in the Bid Proposal;
- 3. By Bid prices mutually agreed upon by the Contractor and the District; or
- 4. By force account, as set forth in Section 1-09.6.

The District will provide the Contractor a copy of the request for a minor change and will require the Contractor to provide a cost estimate for the District's review and approval prior to the work being performed. Approved minor change work performed under this bid item will be performed only after a work directive is issued by the District. Any additional work performed prior to the work directive issued by the District will not be compensated.



Bidder's Declaration and Understanding

The Bidder declares that he has carefully examined the Agreement for the construction of the project, that he has personally inspected the site, that he has satisfied himself as to the quantities involved, including materials and equipment, and conditions of work involved, including the fact that the description of the quantities of work and materials, as included herein, is brief and is intended only to indicate the general nature of the work and to identify the said quantities with the detailed requirements of the Agreement, and that this Proposal is made according to the provisions and under the terms of the Agreement, which Documents are hereby made a part of this Proposal. The Bidder further declares that he has exercised his own judgment regarding the interpretation of subsurface information and has utilized all data which he believes pertinent from the District, other sources and has made such independent investigations as the Bidder deems necessary in arriving at his conclusions.

Agreement Execution

The Bidder agrees that if this Proposal is accepted, he will, within ten (15) calendar days after Notice of Award, complete and sign the Maintenance Agreement, and will at that time deliver to the District executed copies of the Performance Bond, Labor and Material Payment Bond, the Certificate of Insurance (including the Insurance Coverage Questionnaire, and other documentation required by the Contract Documents, and will, to the extent of his Proposal, furnish all work, labor, equipment, chemicals, machinery, tools, apparatus, and other means of construction and do the work and furnish all the materials or services necessary to complete all work as specified or indicated in the Agreement.

Start of Construction and Contract Completion Time

The Bidder further agrees that upon receipt of his Notice to Proceed he will begin work within 15 calendar days of the starting date therein and complete the construction, for all schedules in all respects, within 30 calendar days after the date of Notice to Proceed.

Overtime Codes

Overtime calculations are based on the hourly rate actually paid to the worker. On public works projects, the hourly rate must be not less than the prevailing rate of wage minus the hourly rate of the cost of fringe benefits actually provided for the worker.

- 1. ALL HOURS WORKED IN EXCESS OF EIGHT (8) HOURS PER DAY OR FORTY (40) HOURS PER WEEK SHALL BE PAID AT ONE AND ONE-HALF TIMES THE HOURLY RATE OF WAGE.
 - B. All hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
 - C. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first ten (10) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All other overtime hours and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
 - D. The first two (2) hours before or after a five-eight (8) hour workweek day or a four-ten (10) hour workweek day and the first eight (8) hours worked the next day after either workweek shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All additional hours worked and all worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
 - E. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first eight (8) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All other hours worked Monday through Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
 - F. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first ten (10) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All other overtime hours worked, except Labor Day, shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Labor Day shall be paid at three times the hourly rate of wage.
 - G. The first ten (10) hours worked on Saturdays and the first ten (10) hours worked on a fifth calendar weekday in a fourten hour schedule, shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked in excess of ten (10) hours per day Monday through Saturday and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
