5. **RESOLUTIONS/MOTIONS**

Resolution <u>18-8-15A</u> authorizing agreement with Puget Sound Energy for the installation of Commercial Electric Facilities relating to Project 16-3 Mansion Hill Reservoir Relocation. Motion duly made and seconded. After discussion, the motion carried unanimously.

Resolution <u>18-8-15B</u> declaring an emergency pursuant to RCW 39.04.280(1)(e), waiving the requirements of chapter 39.80 RCW for the retention of engineering services, waiving the competitive bidding requirements of RCW 57.08.050, and authorizing and directing the District Manager or designee to negotiate, approve, and execute the necessary contracts on the District's behalf to perform emergency repair and replacement work along S 240th Pl and 9th Pl S in the City of Des Moines. Motion duly made and seconded. After discussion, the motion carried unanimously.

- 6.1 <u>Sound Transit (Federal Way Link Extension)</u> Highline and Midway Sewer District will hold a joint meeting with Sound Transit at the District's Workshop meeting on August 28th at 9:00 am. Sound Transit representatives will update the Board and staff on the status of the project and answer questions.
- 6.2 <u>Project 16-3 Mansion Hill Reservoir Relocation Bid Advertisement and Contingency</u> The District and Sound Transit's attorneys are preparing a second agreement for repayment terms relating to the Mansion Hill Reservoir Relocation.
 - The advertisement for bids for Project 16-3 will happen in August. The bid opening will be held in early September at the District's headquarters. The Board of Commissioners agreed to a 5% contingency of the awarded contract amount to allow staff to handle change orders administratively in a timely manner.
- 6.3 <u>McMicken Well Inspection and Cleaning</u> Hokkaido Drilling completed the work and repaired the well casing. The District is working with RH2 Engineering and Pump Tech to determine the size for the new pump and motor to fit inside the slightly smaller diameter of the well casing.
- 6.4 <u>Management and Supervisory Leadership Training Program (8/13/18 8/15/18)</u> Logan Wallace and Jon Seibel attended the training.
