- 6.1 <u>Tukwila Intertie</u> The City of Tukwila's insurance company denied the District's claim for the water the District provided to the City through the intertie. This matter will be discussed further at the 10/29/19 Special Board meeting.
- 6.2 <u>Project 19-3 KDM/PHS and 9th PLS Water Main Replacements</u> Reed Trucking & Excavating, Inc. filed a claim against the District for additional compensation. The District denied the claim.
- 6.3 <u>Public Hearing</u> A public hearing for a proposed Site Use and License Agreement with Clear Wireless LLC (McMicken tank site) will be held at the 10/29/19 Special Board Meeting.
- 6.4 <u>Customer Damage Claim</u> A District worker was performing maintenance on a fire hydrant at SW 178th St & Normandy Terrace and was unable to shut off the foot valve resulting in water damage to a homeowner's property. The customer's claim has been submitted to Enduris.
