### 6. 2021 1ST QUARTER FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Jeremy updated the Board on the following Capital Improvement Projects:

<u>Project 16-2 George Landon Pump Station No. 8</u> – The building is constructed and painted. Electrical work ongoing. One change order for the installation of fire sprinklers. The last connection to the transmission main is scheduled for tomorrow. Jeremy reached out to the City of SeaTac to see if they would like to partner for the paving.

<u>Project 16-6 Mansion Hill Pump Station No. 9</u> – The station is operational. Surface restoration and several punch list items remain.

<u>Project 18-2 International Blvd @ SR-509 Road Improvements</u> – Atkinson is the contractor for WSDOT. The plan has been revised to construct an overpass over I-5 instead of underpass.

<u>Project 18-5 34<sup>th</sup> Ave S</u> – The project is between S 160<sup>th</sup> to S 166<sup>th</sup> along 34<sup>th</sup> Ave S. The District's 6" AC main conflicts with the city's project and will be upgraded to 12" DI. An interlocal agreement with the City of SeaTac will be presented at a future Board meeting. Construction is anticipated to begin this summer.

<u>Project 19-1 2019 AC Water Main Replacement (North Hill)</u> – The project is 70% complete. Road overlay this summer with the City of Des Moines. Estimated project completion is July.

<u>Project 20-1 Military Road Loop Water Main Replacement</u> – The District crews completed the main replacement. Military Road S was trench patched last week. Work from S 272<sup>nd</sup> St along Star Lake Road remains.

<u>Project 21-1 Des Moines 24<sup>th</sup> Ave S Water Main Replacement</u> – The project is between S 223<sup>rd</sup> to Kent-Des Moines Road on 24<sup>th</sup> Ave S. The District's 12" AC main conflicts with the city's project. The District will enter an Interlocal Agreement this summer with the City of Des Moines.

<u>Project 21-2 SeaTac 32<sup>nd</sup> Ave S Water Main Replacement</u> – The City's design is at 30% level. We have yet to start our design. Will proceed with design later this year.

<u>Project 21-3 Mansion Hill 2.5 MG Reservoir Int/Ext Recoat & Safety Improvements</u> – The District selected Evergreen Coating Engineers and Gray and Osborne for the design. The project will be bid in 2021 and completed in 2022.

<u>King County Parks Mid Lake to Sound Trail</u> – The District has a 16" transmission main in conflict with the project. Portions of the project are in SeaTac and Burien.

#### 7. 2020 DRAFT ANNUAL REPORT

Jeremy updated the Board on the draft Annual Report: Items discussed include: the COVID pandemic along with WSDOT and Sound Transit projects contributed to not accomplishing all of the goals that were set for the year. The field crews installed 74 new or replaced services and completed two water main replacement projects. The Mansion Hill 4.5 MG Reservoir project was completed. Discussion ensued. No action taken.
