RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A FRANCHISE FEE ON THE RETAIL CUSTOMERS OF THE CITY OF TUKWILA, WASHINGTON, AND AMEND HIGHLINE WATER DISTRICT CODE (HWDC) TO INCORPORATE THE FRANCHISE FEE IN THE APPLICABLE SECTION(S)

WHEREAS, the City of Tukwila and the District entered into a franchise agreement to create an equitable alternative for District ratepayers in lieu of imposing a utility tax, whereby the District customers would receive benefit in exchange for a franchise fee; and

WHEREAS, on April 17, 2023, the City of Tukwila, Washington, adopted Ordinance No. 2700, which granted the District a non-exclusive franchise to construct, maintain, operate, replace, and repair a water system within public rights-of-way of the City of Tukwila, Washington; and

WHEREAS, on May 3, 2023, the Highline Water District Board of Commissioners adopted Resolution 23-5-3C accepting the terms and conditions of the City of Tukwila Ordinance No. 2700; and

WHEREAS, the District shall have the right to recover the Franchise Fee from the District's ratepayers residing within the City and may identify the Franchise Fee as a separate billing item on utility customer billings; and

WHEREAS, the District is authorized to add the state B & O Tax on additional revenue required to pay the City of Tukwila Franchise fee; and

WHEREAS, the franchise fee effective rate (rate revenue + State B & O tax) for the District's City of Tukwila customers is 5.98%.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. The General Manager or designee is authorized to enact the franchise fee on retail customers within the City of Tukwila at an effective rate of 5.98%. The franchise fee will become effective on July 1, 2023.
- 2. District staff is authorized to amend the HWDC to incorporate the franchise fee in the applicable section(s) of the District Codebook.
