6.3 <u>Proposed City of Des Moines Utility Tax</u> – The District used its call-out system to inform the ratepayers that the City of Des Moines was planning to impose a 16% utility tax on water and sewer bills at a public hearing on Thursday, October 29th at 7:00 pm and further asked the ratepayer to express their concern to the City Council through emails and/or speaking at the City's Public Hearing if they oppose this tax.



7. EXECUTIVE SESSION TO DISCUSS POTENTIAL LITIGATION UNDER RCW 42.30.110(1)(i) - CITY OF DES MOINES POTENTIAL UTILITY TAX

Everett reported on his attendance at the October 29, 2015, Des Moines City Council meeting where the Council considered the adoption of a tax on the District's water rates. He advised the Council the District was opposed to the tax for the reasons set forth in Everett's October 27, 2015, letter to the City Manager. It is the District's position the tax will imposed financial hardship on the City's residents who are District ratepayers, the tax is regressive, the District would have difficulty in implementing the tax, District fire hydrant revenues could not be taxed, and the tax was likely unlawful. He reported the City Council at the October 29 meeting had deferred action on the proposed tax, and a meeting with City representatives to discuss the tax had been scheduled for the afternoon of November 4. He will report further to the Board regarding the meeting with the City representatives. He then requested an executive session to further discuss the proposed tax due to potential litigation.

Following discussion, on motion made, seconded and carried unanimously, Koester convened an executive session on that basis. Before the executive session commenced at 9:30 a.m., Koester advised the executive session would conclude at approximately 9:45 a.m. The Commissioners, Everett, DelMar, Milne and Ken Kase, the General Manager of Midway Sewer District, a sewer district that may also be subject to the City's proposed tax, then attended the executive session. At 9:45 a.m., the executive session was extended to 9:50 a.m., which was publicly announced. At 9:50 a.m., the executive session was extended to 10:15 a.m., which was publicly announced. At 10:15 a.m., the executive session concluded and open public meeting reconvened.

Following discussion, the Board authorized District staff and Commissioner Koester to meet with the City representatives to discuss the proposed tax and to report back to the Board.
